- Establishment of Ungra Extension Centre
- Development of conceptual framework for generation and dissemination of technology for rural areas

#### PHASE II OF ASTRA'S DEVELOPMENT (1984-1990)

- (1) Technology Demonstration
- (2) Departmentalization of Governance

- Transformation of ASTRA from cell (with Convenor but no faculty) to centre/ department (with Chairman and permanent faculty)
- Chula, low-cost housing and gasifier programmes
- Community biogas plant project
- Decrease in number of peerreviewed publications
- Decrease in the number of seminars to build awareness and create interest in IISC

#### PHASE III OF ASTRA'S DEVELOPMENT (1990-1997)

- (1) Market-oriented liberalization
- (2) Marginalization of social concerns

- Post-1990 influence of LPG on ASTRA
- Dominant influence of funding agencies on design of projects
- Poverty driven off ASTRA's agenda
- Exclusion of people from technology choice and management
- Top-down government-type technology implementation

- Decrease of delivery/promise ratio
- Decrease of TAP-style of governance
- Secession of SUTRA from ASTRA
- Separate growth of successful GHG mitigation and Gasifier programmes
